## JIEH-YUNG LO


Ever since I could remember, I have always been comfortable and proud of my hyphenated Australian identity as a Chinese-Australian.



of. Alice likes to support younger writers and encourage diverse stories to be shared. In her spare time, Alice likes to read and spend time with her family.


## **MARITA CHENG**


Growing up I wanted to build robots to help people in their everyday lives. I feel proud when persevere and accomplish something difficult.

The more I draw and write, the more I realise that accidents are a necessary part of any creative act...



and illustrators to break into the world of publishing.




